



## **ANSI/AGSC/AGRSS™ 003-2015 Standard**

### **Interpretation #2**

### **Use of Non-OE Glass with Lane Departure Warning Systems**

The AGRSS Standards Committee of the Auto Glass Safety Council (AGSC) has issued the following interpretation of the AGRSS Standard regarding the use of non-OE glass in auto glass replacements on vehicles with lane departure warning systems (LDWS).

“The ANSI/AGSC/AGRSS 003-2015 Standard does not prohibit the installation of non-OE glass on a vehicle with a lane departure warning system (LDWS) if the glass meets ANSI Z26.1 as required by Section 5.2 of the Standard and the owner/operator is advised in writing that recalibration of the LDWS may be required.”
